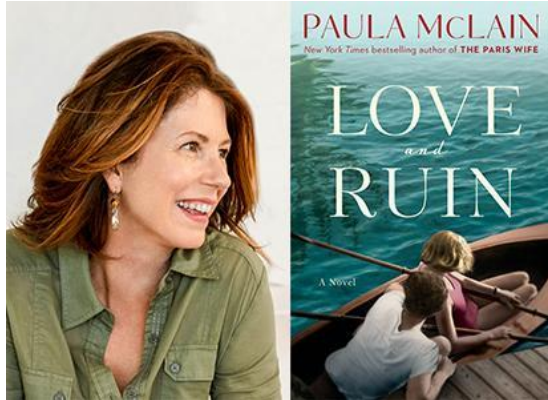

The Paris Wife, a *New York Times* and international bestseller, has been published in thirty-four languages. The recipient of fellowships from Yaddo, The MacDowell Colony, the Cleveland Arts Prize, the Ohio Arts Council and the National Endowment for the Arts, McLain is also the author of *A Ticket to Ride*, her first novel; two collections of poetry; and her memoir, *Like Family, Growing up in Other People's Houses*, which chronicles her difficult childhood in the foster care system. McLain received her MFA in poetry from the University of Michigan in 1996 and currently lives in Cleveland with her family.
